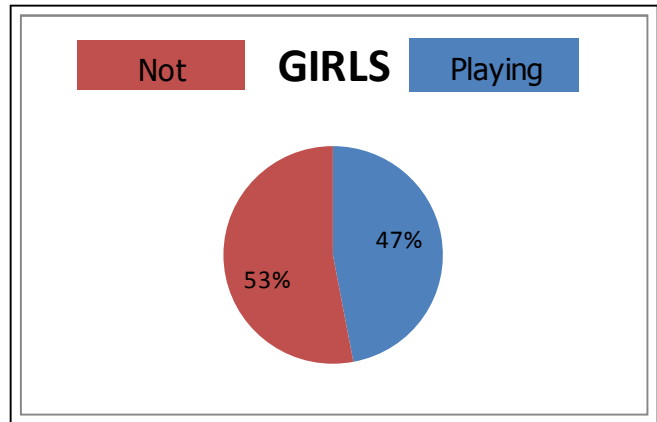
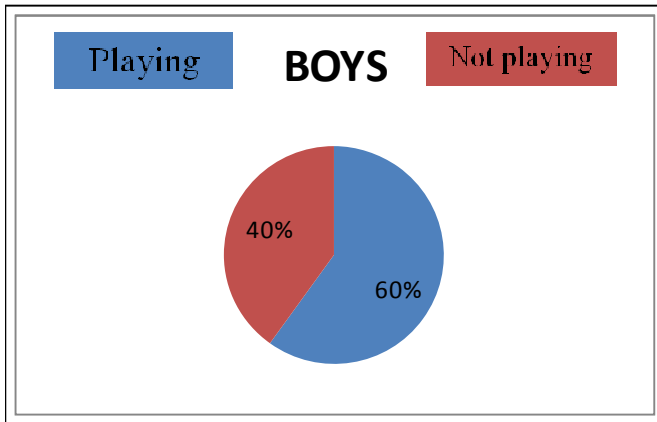

Each location had some significance in the life of Jesus beginning with His hometown where it seems He was viewed as an ordinary man (Luke 1:26-33). The end of the journey found the disciples in awe of this Jesus who could even calm the wind and the waves.
