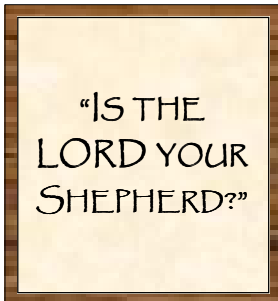

attitude makes a difference. Students were also asked to remember their Bibles for each chapel session and encouraged to use them.

The next chapel was on September 1, 2011 and began again with students leading their peers in worship assisted by Mr. Marasco. After the songs were sung, our speaker was introduced by Pastor John.

Mr. Lonie Eidson from First Baptist Church in Glasgow was our speaker. His focus was on the phrase "The Lord is my Shepherd" from Psalm 23, verse 1.

Pastor Eidson spoke of how David fought Goliath knowing that his Shepherd would take care of him as a sheep of his fold. Even as David fought off wolves and bears to keep his sheep safe, so God would do the same for him as His child. God does the same for His children today.

The next point given was "As children of the King, God knows us." Here Pastor Eid-

son referenced John 10, verses 1 through 4. As parents know their children, so God knows His and still loves us despite the things we do which are not honoring to Him.

Next, everyone was encouraged to turn to the book of Ephesians and look at chapter 4, verses 11 through 16. Here the kind Pastor reminded us that the Shepherd guides His sheep twenty-four hours a day, seven days each week.

Pastor Eidson spoke of how America is saturated in consumerism despite its religious history. He went on to say that we have committed adulterous treason against the God of the universe. Here, the book of Acts was referenced, verses 1 through 3.

He spoke of Creation being the primary document of the Christian faith yet we as humans are oblivious to its full import to our beliefs. Additionally, he mentioned that the most tolerated sins of the

church are malice, gossip, hatred, slander, etc. as mentioned in Ephesians.

Truly, we cannot live the Christian life without God. Even in the book of James we are told to bridle our tongues, yet many struggle to say kind words. We cannot live the Christian life without God was once again emphasized.

In the end, Pastor Eidson noted that there is no "self" in eternity and asked his listeners to consider a simple question: Who is number one in your life? He also mentioned that it is okay to be overwhelmed by God.

The end of his message was tied to the beginning: "Until the Lord is our Shepherd, we are in want." Where do you stand?

The final challenge for everyone: Is the Lord your Shepherd?

INTRODUCING FRANCIS

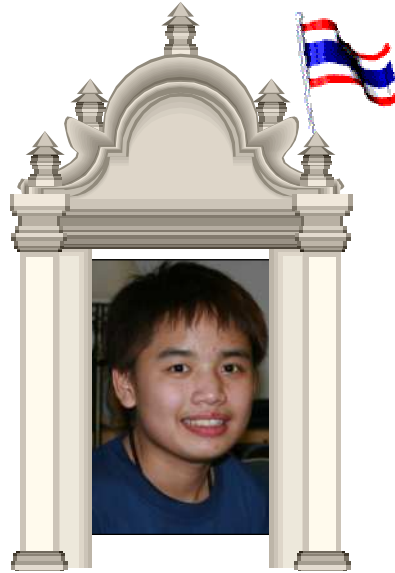
