
Getting to know Mr. Bob Burkhart By Byron Ewing




Mr. Nathan Lu By Abby Olfert

Mr. Michael Rickman By Jaden Gibson


Among many new arrivals this year at Lustre Christian High School is Mr. Michael Rickman.
